Writing the Body—This workshop will focus on letting your stories or poems emerge through physical experiences. Or you may choose to recall experiences that you've never looked at from the point of view of your feet or your navel—stories that you never thought of as being about the body, but that will now be filtered through it. We'll look at both poetry and prose by writers who have attempted this and try out for ourselves, some new perspectives. As time permits the instructor and the group will give feedback from your work in progress.
